Momentum-backed Pattern Breakout



Technical Highlights

Persistence selling pressure triggered a major correction phase in the stock since July 2024. Recently, the stock continued to consolidate within a range, forming a falling triangle pattern. Yesterday, the resurgence of buying interest renewed the stock's positive momentum and led the stock to close higher (+4.0%). Following this positive closing, the stock successfully initiated the triangle pattern breakout. Additionally, the stock also traded above its 50-EMA line for the first time since late May 2025, reinforcing the built-up of the stock's bullish outlook. With these favourable technical signals, we think the stock could extend its recovery trajectory in the near term.

Momentum indicators are showing strength. The RSI is spiking up, signalling the stock's buying interest is accumulating. Likewise, the display of a golden cross formation in the MACD yesterday further validate the stock's short-term bullish outlook.

For an ideal entry opportunity, it can be observed in between RM0.680 and RM0. 685. The first resistance level to eye on would be at RM0.725, and a breakout above this level could see the stock ascending towards RM0.765. On the downside, if the stock moved in opposite direction towards and below the RM0.645 level, this could indicate a false pattern breakout and follows by another consolidation phase.

Pending Pattern Breakout?



Technical Highlights

After reaching its 52-week high at RM1.24, the stock dipped into a wide consolidation phase. Recently, the stock started to rebound and moved higher and above both its 20-EMA and 50-EMA lines. At the yesterday's closing price of RM1.02, the stock was on the verge of breaking through the neckline of a double bottom pattern. Supported by the stock's strong bullish momentum as evidenced by the stock's 3 consecutive sessions of higher close, we think this should form a ground for the stock to breach above the neckline and initiate the double bottom breakout in the near term.

Momentum indicators are supportive of the pattern breakout. The RSI is climbing towards its overbought zone, evidencing the stock's sustained buying strength. Similarly, the stock's near-term positive momentum is ascertained by the formation of a golden cross in the MACD yesterday.

An ideal entry for this stock would be a range of between RM1.00 to RM1.02. The first resistance to watch is RM1.03, and if broken, the next target would be RM1.12. Should the stock's momentum remain strong, this could pave way for the stock challenge its next target at RM1.15. On the downside, if the stock trades below RM0.945, this could bring an indication of commencement of another market correction phase

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Glossary of commonly used technical terms

Exponential Moving Average (EMA)	An indicator frequently used in technical analysis showing the average value of a security's price over a set period with greater weightage placed on the most recent data points.
Moving Average Convergence Divergence (MACD)	A trend-following momentum indicator that shows the relationship between two moving averages of prices. The MACD is calculated by subtracting the 26-day exponential moving average (EMA) from the 12-day EMA. A 9-day EMA of the MACD, called the "signal line", is then plotted on top of the MACD, functioning as a trigger for buy and sell signals.
Stochastic	A technical momentum indicator that compares a security's closing price to its price range over a given time period. The indicator's sensitivity to market movements can be reduced by adjusting the time period or by taking a moving average of the result.
Average True Range (ATR)	A measure of volatility whereby the indicator is the greatest of the following: - current high less the current low; - the absolute value of the current high less the previous close; - the absolute value of the current low less the previous close;
Bollinger Band	A band plotted 2 standard deviations away from a simple moving average.
On-Balance Volume (OBV)	A method used in technical analysis to detect momentum, the calculation of which relates volume to price change. OBV provides a running total of volume and shows whether this volume is flowing in or out of a given security.
Support	The price level which, historically, a stock has had difficulty falling below. It is thought of as the level at which a lot of buyers tend to enter the stock.
Resistance	The price at which a stock or market can trade, but not exceed, for a certain period of time. Often referred to as "resistance level".
Reversal	A change in the direction of a price trend. On a price chart, reversals undergo a recognizable change in the price structure. An uptrend, which is a series of higher highs and higher lows, reverses into a downtrend by changing to a series of lower highs and lower lows. A downtrend, which is a series of lower highs and lower lows, reverses into an uptrend by changing to a series of higher highs and higher lows.
Divergence	When the price of an asset and an indicator, index or other related asset move in opposite directions.
Overbought	In technical analysis, this term describes a situation in which the price of a security has risen to such a degree – usually on high volume – that an oscillator has reached its upper bound. This is generally interpreted as a sign that the price of the asset is becoming overvalued and may experience a pullback.
Oversold	A situation in technical analysis where the price of an asset has fallen to such a degree – usually on high volume – that the oscillator has reached a lower bound. This is generally interpreted as a sign that the price of the asset is becoming undervalued and may represent a buying opportunity for investors



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
