## Triangle Breakout In Play



### Technical Highlights

After spending nearly 4 months consolidating between March and June 2025, the stock finally broke out of its sideways range, posting an impressive 27% rally within just two weeks. Since then, it has entered into a tightening triangle pattern, a classic continuation setup. Just yesterday, the stock staged a decisive breakout from this pattern, gaining over 3% alongside a steady rise in volume. The next phase to watch is whether this momentum can hold, as the market digests the breakout and gauges the follow-through strength.

Momentum indicators are currently supportive. The RSI stands at 56, staying firmly above the neutral 50 line, indicating positive sentiment without entering overbought territory. Meanwhile, the MACD is on the verge of a golden cross as selling volume continues to decline.

An ideal entry lies between RM2.27 and RM2.31. Immediate resistance is seen at RM2.49, followed by RM2.70 if momentum sustains. On the downside, a drop below RM2.15 may signal a breakdown in structure and a return of selling pressure.

## Triangle Breakout Watch



### Technical Highlights

The stock has shown strong resilience at the RM0.260 support level, which has been tested more than five times since earlier this year. That level continues to act as a firm base, with price action rebounding steadily from June to present. Just yesterday, the stock gained 6% and touched the upper boundary of its triangle formation, signalling a possible breakout on the horizon. Volume also surged to its highest level since May 2025. Adding to the bullish case, the stock is now trading above all three key EMAs following the strong session.

Momentum indicators are flashing early signs of strength. The RSI has rebounded well from the neutral zone and currently stands at 60. The MACD, meanwhile, confirmed its bullish crossover last week, indicating a positive shift in trend as the histogram begins to turn upward.

An ideal buy zone is between RM0.270 and RM0.280, where risk-reward remains favourable. Immediate resistance sits at RM0.300, with the next upside target at RM0.320 should the breakout gain traction. However, if price slips below RM0.260, this would invalidate the structure and could trigger renewed selling pressure from investor anchored to the long-standing support base.

## Glossary of commonly used technical terms

Exponential Moving Average (EMA)	An indicator frequently used in technical analysis showing the average value of a security's price over a set period with greater weightage placed on the most recent data points.
Moving Average Convergence Divergence (MACD)	A trend-following momentum indicator that shows the relationship between two moving averages of prices. The MACD is calculated by subtracting the 26-day exponential moving average (EMA) from the 12-day EMA. A 9-day EMA of the MACD, called the "signal line", is then plotted on top of the MACD, functioning as a trigger for buy and sell signals.
Stochastic	A technical momentum indicator that compares a security's closing price to its price range over a given time period. The indicator's sensitivity to market movements can be reduced by adjusting the time period or by taking a moving average of the result.
Average True Range (ATR)	A measure of volatility whereby the indicator is the greatest of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- current high less the current low;</li><li>- the absolute value of the current high less the previous close;</li><li>- the absolute value of the current low less the previous close;</li></ul>
Bollinger Band	A band plotted 2 standard deviations away from a simple moving average.
On-Balance Volume (OBV)	A method used in technical analysis to detect momentum, the calculation of which relates volume to price change. OBV provides a running total of volume and shows whether this volume is flowing in or out of a given security.
Support	The price level which, historically, a stock has had difficulty falling below. It is thought of as the level at which a lot of buyers tend to enter the stock.
Resistance	The price at which a stock or market can trade, but not exceed, for a certain period of time. Often referred to as "resistance level".
Reversal	A change in the direction of a price trend. On a price chart, reversals undergo a recognizable change in the price structure. An uptrend, which is a series of higher highs and higher lows, reverses into a downtrend by changing to a series of lower highs and lower lows. A downtrend, which is a series of lower highs and lower lows, reverses into an uptrend by changing to a series of higher highs and higher lows.
Divergence	When the price of an asset and an indicator, index or other related asset move in opposite directions.
Overbought	In technical analysis, this term describes a situation in which the price of a security has risen to such a degree – usually on high volume – that an oscillator has reached its upper bound. This is generally interpreted as a sign that the price of the asset is becoming overvalued and may experience a pullback.
Oversold	A situation in technical analysis where the price of an asset has fallen to such a degree – usually on high volume – that the oscillator has reached a lower bound. This is generally interpreted as a sign that the price of the asset is becoming undervalued and may represent a buying opportunity for investors

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
